There had been no depot or sector reallocations of 37's during the period 29.11.89 to 23.12.89. 37702 has been named 'Taff Merthyr' (this name formerly being carried by 56035) and repainted into Railfreight 'triple tone grey' coal sector livery. Other livery changes previously unreported are as follows: 071/104 - Departmental grey; 404/405/417 - Inter City/mainline; triple tone Construction - 425; Metals - 042/241; Petroleum - 078/232; Speedlink - 053/242.
