NEWSDESK

There were no depot or sector reallocations during the period 2.6.90 - 29.6.90.

37156 and 37170 have received aerials and RETB equipment for working the Kyle and Far North lines from Inverses. 37170's is of the shorter type as worn by the Stratford based examples for the East Suffolk line, whereas 37156's is the longer and thinner style as fitted to the ETM 37/4's, and if TOPs follows logic (!) it is probably from 37421 which was transferred to Eastfield last month and is now shown as not carrying radio equipment. It is thought that the reason for this duo receiving RETB equipment is principally to work freights over the RETB lines as the regular use of the 37/4's on passenger workings has left the freight sector rather short of motive power.

37220 (CF/FPEK) has been named 'WESTERLEIGH' with a badge of the Murco oil company fitted above the nameplate. It was on display as such at the Gloucester 150 event on 1.7.90 along with 37's 015/038/142/185/198/350/885/906. In conjunction with this event, 37131+235, 37074+100 and 37691+800 worked on a variety of special passenger trains and 37146 at least was stabled in the new yard.

37072 is thought to have been removed from the 'hit list', its place being taken by 37077, and 60005 has arrived at Motherwell for crew training - its first duty is likely to be the Hunterston-Ravenscraig ore trains which are currently hauled by double headed 37's of Motherwells FMGM sector.

There were also a number of special workings on Sunday July 1st involving 37131+235. 37074+100 and 37691+800, full details of which I shall give next month when I have all the times. As you can see from the above, Scotland is the place to be at the moment, and in particular on the Aberdeen-Inverness line. These, mainly Sprinter replacement, diagrams are expected to last until the class 158's start to enter service in numbers, which is not expected to be until at least the end of July. Probably the best train to watch is the 1712 Dundee-Montrose and 1808 return to Perth. It has been confirmed that this is actually booked for the Perth ballast loco which is nearly always a 37. The DMU originally scheduled to work this service has been transferred to an additional 1715 Dundee-Glasgov service. The Montrose runs with 4 coaches usually and is prone to late running on the return journey as only 9 minutes are allowed for the run round, although it does have 19 minutes at Dundee. It is worked by the DMU on Saturdays, Other regular workings include the Aberdeen 'comuter' services and the 0915 Inverness-Elgin and 1018 return. This latter service is nearly always 707, although 708 has appeared, this turn fits in nicely with their regular ballast working off Inverness. The C724 Perth-Glasgow mentioned last month has not been producing 37's. A few details of locomotive failures are included in the gen list above while other interesting notes will be included in the narrative report next month.
