EDITORIAL

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING: A final reminder that this will be held in the upstairs room at The County, St Helens Street, Ipswich, on Saturday 23rd November 1991 with an ammended starting time of 1345. If you are coming by rail it is best to catch an Ipswich Buses service 12 or 13 (8 buses per hour) from the bus shelter immediately opposite the station doors to Tower Ramparts bus station (33p exact fare only). NEWSDESK

There had been no depot or sector reallocations upto 26.10.91.

LIVERIES: Newly reported changes are 37013/261 - Railfreight Distribution, 37175 - civil engineers, and 37696/797 - Railfreight Coal.

GENERAL: It is understood from sources at Crewe Works that 37903, there following its collision with 37137 which is still present as well, will be released with an English Electric 12CSVT engine reinstated. Although not scheduled to be done until the new financial year in April, I understand work has already started. The most logical renumbering would be to 37882, as this would fit in with the other refurbished centre box ballasted loco's that also have Brush alternator equipment.

In connection with the reopening of the Tondu-Pontycymer line, which is scheduled for early November, 37697 worked light engine from Margam then over this route on Monday 28th October for the benefit of S & T staff. The next day (29/10) it made two trips with 18 empty MGR wagons, driver route learning between Tondu and Pontycymer. It is thought that this was the first train on the branch, excepting the weedkiller, for around 5 years. There has also been, and will be for the forseeable future, coal trains from Maesteg as there is still coal being found in the tips above the town. There were due to be two trains during week commencing 28/10 to Jersey Marine Steel Supply on Wednesday and Friday.

In Anglia, the Sizewell construction trains are due to cease on 17/12/91. Currently, this runs as 6Y60, 0500 Ipswich-Leiston and 6Y61, 0926 Leiston-Ipswich (Thursday and Saturday excepted), and is limited to 600 tons which includes the loco weight. This is because anything more and the train is prone to being unable to restart on the steep bank on the freight branch when the rails are wet or greasy, and Construction sector are no longer prepared to pay for two loco's to be provided.

37429 was noted at Motherwell TMD on 5/10/91 minus one of its "Eisteddfod Genedlaethol" nameplates. It was paired with 37373 for use on the Gunnie-Clitheroe cement.

PASSENGER INFORMATION

Unfortunately some errors crept into the gen in the September "Syphon Extra" and October "Syphon!" which I am happy to rectify. On 14/8 the 1050 Inverness-Aberdeen was worked by 37153 (as correctly shown in September "Syphon Extra"), not 37428 which only worked the 1930 Inverness-Aberdeen ECS on that date. On 15/8, 37153 did 1050 Inverness-Aberdeen and 1714 Aberdeen-Inverness, not the 1524 Aberdeen-Inverness which was worked by 37408 as correctly shown last month. There seems some debate over what 37152 actually did on 21/9, although it certainly wasn't Ayr-Dumbarton as shown last month. I have been informed it toworked the 0725 Glasgow-Mallaig charter only to Cowlairs where 37404 went forward, although there was an SRPS charter that day that was advertised as 0705 Edinburgh-Fort William, not via Glasgow. Finally, reference to 37225 working 1855 Waterloo-Exeter from Salisbury to Exeter on 29/9 should be deleted. On with this months latest 'gen', which includes the following two "standard diagram" codes:

This months 'Working of the Month' goes to 37010 on the 1705 Carlisle-Hereford Regional Railways organised excursion listed in last months gen, which ran on 12/10/91.

REGIONAL VIEW (brief notes, full details in next months "Syphon!") ANGLIA: 37216 worked a 2155 Ipswich-Oulton Broad South ballast on 29/10, running as 8T35 instead of the booked 6T35 due to the inclusion of two 35mph restricted hoppers. The next night, 37144 worked what was presumed to be the same train, passing Beccles at 0315 towards Lowestoft and returning towards Ipswich at 0445. On 23/10, 37144 and an unknown

RfD 37 worked 4C67 (0350 Felixstowe North-Stratford) to Ipswich following the failure of the booked Rfd pair. On arrival at Ipswich there was no electric available because of riots on the West Coast, so 37023 went forward to Stratford. MIDLAND: Information on 6V?? Usk-Birkenhead North coal service shows this to be a Monday Wednesday and Friday service arriving at Birkenhead North between 7 and 8am, returning as 6MO9 between 8:30 and 9am. 37's noted on this train include 37223 (11/10) and 37222

(25/10 and 30/10). WESTERN: A visitor to Devon and Cornwall on 11/10/91 found all Laira's 37's located as follows: 37674 at Laira @ 1345, 37673 at Plymouth North Rd station @ 1500 on a Marsh Mills to Fowey Harbour service, 37411/412/417/420/669/672/675 at St Blazey @ 1630, 37670 passed Par station e/b on Clay wagons, and 37671 ran light onto St Blazey about 1700.
